Volunteer Safeguarding Training Session

Thank you to all the volunteers who attended the safeguarding training session on Tuesday 20th February. We are grateful to see that we have quite a few parents who are happy to come and volunteer here at our school. We look forward to seeing our volunteers supporting in school shortly.

NSPCC

We are delighted to confirm that we will be welcoming NSPCC volunteers into school on Monday 4th March to lead 'Speak Out Stay Safe' workshops for our year 2 and year 5 children. Other year groups will not miss out and will receive an NSPCC planned lesson too. Ahead of this on Friday 1st March, children will be watching an NSPCC KS1 (Reception to year 2) or KS2 (year 3 to 6) assembly led by Ant & Dec (online!) *Speak out. Stay safe.* is a programme for children aged 5-11 which aims to help children understand abuse in all its forms and to recognise the signs of abuse. Children are taught to speak out if they are worried, either to a safe adult or Childline. This supports our work on safeguarding in the curriculum as one of our school priorities. If you have any questions, please do contact me.

The NSPCC would like to gather feedback from pupils in years 3-6 about the *Speak out*. Stay safe. programme to gauge their learning. This will be voluntary and children can still take part in the programme if they don't take part in the survey. Parent/carer letter to follow next week.

Lent/Father Chris, 40 day challenge!

We were pleased to welcome Father Chris into school yesterday to help us understand Lent. When we think of Lent we may associate it with 'giving something up' but we were pleased that Father Chris shared with the children the idea of the '40 day challenge' involving children 'giving back to others' in the form of an act of kindness during Lent. We think this is a fantastic idea, links well with an earlier assembly where we considered our 'daily act of kindness' and of course links with one of our school values 'kindness.' We look forward to hearing from the children how they may be getting on with the challenge, both at home and in the community as well as at school. Please do encourage your child to share news of this with their teacher and class!
